DoD celebrates Abraham Lincoln's legacy

WHO & WHAT: The U.S. Armed Forces will conduct a Presidential Armed Forces Full Honor wreath-laying ceremony, on behalf of the nation, to commemorate the 16th President of the United States, Abraham Lincoln's 208th birthday.

Brig. Gen. Mark C. Strong, deputy director of operations, readiness and mobilization, Department of the Army, will host the ceremony.
